Measuring Length Explore – Answer Key

Materials:

- Color Tiles
- Cash Register Tape, cut in 15 inch long strips
- Linear Measurement Recording Sheet, included in this lesson

Procedure:

- 1. Teacher: "A Color Tile is about 1 inch square so we can use our Color Tiles to measure the length of an object".
- Demonstrate how to lay the Color Tiles side by side along the length of their activity sheet. Count the number of Color Tiles. Teacher: "This paper is <u>(8)</u> Color Tiles long so the paper is about <u>(8)</u> inches long.
- 3. Direct students to follow the same procedure using Color Tiles to measure small classroom objects such as pencils, paper, erasers, their desks, etc.
- 4. Allow students time to measure objects using Color Tiles and then bring the students back to whole group.
- 5. Distribute a 15" long strip of cash register tape to each student to make an inch ruler.
- 6. Demonstrate how to place one Color Tile next to the left edge of the strip and make a tic mark on the strip at the right side of the Color Tile. Write a "1" under the tic mark. Lift the Color Tile and place the left side of the Color Tile at the "1" tic mark and make a new tic mark at the right side of the Color Tile. Write a "2" under this tic mark. Continue until the "rulers" are about 12 inches long.
- 7. Demonstrate how to measure objects with their "rulers".
- 8. Ask students to use their **Explore Activity Sheet** to measure objects with Color Tiles and with their rulers.



Sample Answers:

Object	How Many Color Tiles Long?	About How Many Inches Long?
Math Book	10	About 10 inches
Paper	8	About 8 inches
Marker	6	About 6 inches
Paper Clip	2	About 2 inches
